



TigerLion Arts seeks Community Chorus for *NATURE*, a walking play performing this fall at Washburn Fair Oaks Park & Minnesota Landscape Arboretum, in Celebration of Henry David Thoreau's 200th Birthday!

The Project

Does being outdoors invigorate you? Would you like to perform in an ensemble of professional actors? This fall TigerLion Arts will present the beloved walking play *Nature* ~ the outdoor telling of Ralph Waldo Emerson, Henry David Thoreau & their mutual love of the natural world. The play is written & created by Minneapolis-based actor Tyson Forbes (a direct descendant of Ralph Waldo Emerson) & director/producer Markell Kiefer. In celebration of the 2017 Bicentennial of Henry David Thoreau, *Nature* will be offered at **Washburn Fair Oaks Park** (Minneapolis) and at the **Minnesota Landscape Arboretum** (Chaska, MN).

The Community Chorus

The Community Chorus plays an integral role in the play, performing choral music & movement in specific sections of the piece & helping to guide the audience from scene to scene. This is a truly transformative opportunity for local students & community members to be integrated into a unique production & to get an inside view of how this professional, community-building experience operates. No prior acting experience or formal voice training is required, although participants should be able to carry a tune. Previous singing experience is a plus. Children under age 12 must be accompanied by an adult. Participants should be prepared to be outside in varying weather for at least 2 hours at a time & be able to walk on uneven ground.

Time Commitment

The run-time of the show is 90 minutes. Call time is 1 hr prior to showtime. The tentative rehearsal and performance schedule is as follows (participants can perform as available):
